After all, at many points along his journey, he was defying common sense, prudence and the strong recommendations of friends and superiors, about the wisdom of exploring a strange country alone—a country approaching chaos and revolution.

The title had to capture the idea of the wonderfully rich experiences that would accrue to that traveler willing to take risks and court a bit of danger.

And given the period in which the story took place, I felt the subtitle needed to revoke an earlier time, and perhaps an earlier and more colorful style of writing.


